
Documentation of Small Whorled Pogonia (Isotria medeoloides) in Sweden, Maine



First noted on September 6, 2013



Location:

- On gently sloping ground in mixed woods (predominately beech, oak, maple, hemlock, and white pine).
- Noticed in area with moderate clearing of small hardwoods and pines within the past year.
- Dense leaf litter





Description:

Fruiting plant approximately 10" from base to top of fruit. Slender stalk.



Whorl approximately 5" in diameter
